From kids capturing images on cell phones to the shortest movie ever nominated for an Oscar, the 2-Minute Movie Contest has delighted curious Fargo Film Festival audiences for years. See what a group of ingenious artists can do when given but a single rule: Tell us a story in 120 seconds or less.

Immaculate with special guest Will Greenfield

In this gripping new film, Sydney Sweeney (Anyone But You, Euphoria, The White Lotus) stars as Cecilia, an American nun of devout faith who embarks on a journey to a remote convent in the picturesque Italian countryside. Cecilia's warm welcome quickly devolves into a nightmare as it becomes clear her new home barbers a sinister secret and unspeakable horrors.

After the film, Executive Producer Will Greenfield will appear live onstage for a conversation about Immaculate and the journey of his career. To celebrate his artistic achievements, Greenfield will receive the Fargo Film Festival's most distinguished honor, the Ted M. Larson Award.

Originally hailing from Kentucky, Greenfield's career in the film industry has taken him all over the world. He steadily climbed the ranks from production assistant to production manager to producer/executive producer. Greenfield has worked with some of the industry's top talent, including Quentin Tarantino, Jeff Nichols, Yorgos Lanthimos, Sam Levinson, Lena Dunham, Jon Favreau, Spike Lee, and Frank Darabont. Greenfield served as executive producer for season two of HBO's smash hit series *Euphoria*, which garnered 16 Emmy nominations. He is currently working as executive producer on an upcoming film from director Ryan Coogler.

THE 2024 FARGO FILM FESTIVAL MARGIE BAILLY VOLUNTEER SPIRIT AWARD Kendra O'Brien

KENDRA O'BRIEN is a North Dakota native who came to Fargo to attend NDSU and promptly fell in love with the Fargo Theatre at a screening of the movie *Shine*. She completed her undergraduate and Master of Arts degree programs and was married (at the Fargo Theatre!) in 2004. Together with her husband, Kendra parents the two most awesome sons in the world.

Kendra works at FBS, a local real estate software company, and serves on the company's Board of Directors. As a volunteer, she has participated in local art grant processes and NDSU department and college advisory boards, and she is honored to serve as a board member for the Fargo Theatre.

In 2011, inspired by her sister Lisa, Kendra began volunteering for the Fargo Film Festival. In the years following, she has served as a highly opinionated juror, jury chair, and festival co-chair.

Kendra is a passionate advocate for documentary films. She notes,"A well-made documentary gives the viewer a chance to see the world through someone else's eyes. I've learned so much from the hundreds of documentary features I've watched for the Festival, and I'm better for it."

Kendra loves microphones, a well-balanced coffee, the Oxford comma, her amazing family and friends, and the volunteers of the Fargo Film festival.



THE FARGO FILM FESTIVAL HONORS THE LIFE AND WORK OF TOM Brandau

As a filmmaker, actor, writer, festival volunteer, and educator, Tom Brandau's contributions to the cinematic arts will be treasured for generations. Tom received his MFA from Towson University, where he also began his career in film eduction. In 2003 he moved to Moorhead to join the faculty of the MSUM film department. Over the next 15 years, Tom would instruct and inspire hundreds of young filmmakers while continuing to produce acclaimed work of his own. He served on the Fargo Theatre's Board of Directors and in several leadership roles for the Fargo Film Festival. Tom passed away in 2021 after a valiant battle with cancer. His memory will be cherished by his fellow festival volunteers, his students, his wife and creative partner Janet, and his stepchildren Kate and Daniel.

THE FARGO FILM FESTIVAL HONORS THE LIFE AND WORK OF RUSTY Casselton

HAROLD "RUSTY" CASSELTON was known around the world for his contributions to film restoration and preservation. Rusty collaborated with mentor Ted Larson for many years, and their efforts resulted in a variety of wonderful opportunities for movie fans, who regularly attended popular events like Silent Movie Night at the Fargo Theatre and the Summer Cinema series on the campus of MSUM. He is greatly missed by the Fargo Film Festival, his students, his extended family, his friends, his colleagues, his wife Cindy, and daughters Hannah and Amanda.
